

10TH KGM JUNIOR AMATEUR OPEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP 2014

(YBHG DATO' SEBASTIAN TING CHALLENGE TROPHY)

9th – 10th June 2014

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

The following Conditions, together with any additions or amendments as published by The Committee on the relevant entry form or at the golf course, will apply under Rule 33-1:-

1. MANAGEMENT

The 10th KGM Junior Amateur Open Golf Championship 2014 (hereinafter referred to as the championship) shall be managed by an Organizing Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) whose decisions in all matters relating to the Championship shall be final.

2. VENUE AND DATE

The Championship will be played over the course of Kelab Golf Miri, Sarawak on Monday 9th June 2014 and Tuesday 10th June 2014

3. RULES OF PLAY

The Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Ltd and their interpretations as contained in the “Decisions on the Rules of Golf 2014-2015”, these Conditions of Competitions and any additional Conditions of Competitions together with the Local Rules established by the Tournament Committee for the Competitions will apply.

4. FORMAT

The championship is a solely gross event and will be decided by stroke play over 2 rounds of 18 holes for all Boys and Girls Groups. The Committee may cancel any round if it considers the course is not in a playable condition or if there are circumstances that render the proper playing of the game impossible.

5. ELIGIBILITY AND CLASSES

The Championship is open to all boys and girls Amateur Golfers in accordance with the Rules of Amateur Status as approved by the R&A Rules Limited. Classes are assigned as per the tables below and age limits would be based on the player's actual age as on the final day of the championship, 10th June 2014. Any player may choose to upgrade to a higher class but no player may downgrade to a lower class.

BOYS

Class C	11-12 years (born between 11-6-2001 to 10-6-2003)	All handicaps
Class D	10 years and under (born on or after 11-6-2003)	All handicaps

If there are less than 5 entries for any class, the Committee may, at its absolute discretion, combine players in that class with players in any other class or classes.

6. SIZE OF FIELD

The field shall be limited to 100 players on first come first served basis

7. ENTRY FORM AND CLOSING DATE

Duly completed entry form together with a copy of the player's birth certificate or identity card must reach the Committee on or before 30th May, 2014, Friday, 12noon.

All entries will be subject to the approval of the Committee which reserves the rights to accept or refuse, or having accepted, subsequently reject any entry without giving any reason for its decision.

8. DRAW

For the first round, players belonging to the same class shall be drawn together unless the Committee determines otherwise

For the final round, draw for the leader groups shall be based on the scores returned in the first round by players for those classes playing from the same teeing grounds.

Tee times and groups will be posted on the notice boards at the Club house and at the Information Desk at the official hotel, Dynasty Hotel.

The Committee reserves the rights to vary the draw and starting times at its own discretion.

9. PRIZES

(a) The overall champion shall be awarded with the KGM Junior Amateur Open Golf Championship Trophy (Best player from Boys and girls Classes A and B combined)

(b) Winner and two runners up in each of the Classes A, B, C and D in both boys and girls categories

The Committee may, at its absolute discretion, determine the number of prizes for any of the classes as it deems fit.

10. DECISION OF TIES

In the event of a tie for the overall championship, the players tying shall as soon as possible continue in a "sudden death" play off from Hole 18 repeatedly until the winner is decided.

In the event of a tie for any other placing for all classes, the tie shall be decided by a count-back system of matching scorecards in the following orders:

- a. Last 18 holes
- b. Last 9 holes
- c. Last 6 holes
- d. Last 3 holes
- e. And finally the last hole

If the tie is still undecided after matching scorecards, the winner shall be determined by lot.

11. TEEING GROUNDS

BOYS

12. TRANSPORTATION

All players must not ride on any form of transportation during a stipulated round unless authorized by the Committee.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF CONDITION:

Two strokes for each hole at which any breach occurred. Maximum penalty per round: Four strokes. Use of any unauthorized form of transportation must be discontinued immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred. Otherwise, the player is disqualified.

13. CADDIES

All players in Classes A and B shall not be allowed to engage any caddy and must carry their own bags or use trolleys.

Players in classes C and D are permitted to each engage a caddy. Such caddy must be appointed through the club. Players are not allowed from having their coaches, parents, friends and relatives serve as their caddies.

14. STARTING TIMES

All players must start at their respective times as stipulated by the Committee. (Rule 6-3a applies)

15. PACE OF PLAY (NOTE TO RULE 6-7)

a) **Time Allowed:**

Each hole has been given a maximum completion time based upon the length and difficulty of the hole. The maximum time allotted for the completion of 18 holes will be available prior to play.

Definition of Out of Position:

The first group and any group after a starter's gap will be considered to be "out of position" if at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes played. Any following group will be considered "out of position" if it is more than the starting time interval behind the group in front and has exceeded the time allowed for the number of holes played.

b) Procedure When Group is Out of Position

1. If the decision is taken to time the group, each player in the group will be subject to individual timing by a Rules Official. Each player in the group will be advised that they are “out of position” and are being timed.
2. The maximum time allocated per shot is 40 seconds. 10 extra seconds are allowed for the first player to play:
 - On the tee box;
 - On the subsequent shots; and
 - On the putting green.

The timing will start when a player has reached his ball, it is his turn to play and he is able to play without interference or distraction.

On the putting green, timing will start when the player has had a reasonable amount of time to lift, clean and replace his ball, repair ball marks and move loose impediments on his line of putt. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole and/or behind the ball will count as time taken for the next stroke.

3. Timing ceases when a group is either back in position in relation to the preceding group or within the allocated time for the holes played.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF CONDITION:

c) Procedure When Again Out Of Position During the Same Round

If a group is “out of position” more than once during a round the above procedure will apply on each occasion. Bad times and the application of penalties in the same round will be carried forward until the round is completed.

16. ETIQUETTE, BEHAVIOUR ON THE COURSE

All players should practice good etiquette as detailed out in Section 1 of the Rules of Golf.

Serious Breach of Etiquette

The following are considered “serious breaches of etiquette” for this competition:-

- i. Usage of hand phone during a round to the annoyance and distractions of other players.
- ii. Verbal abuse of fellow competitor / official / staff.
- iii. Intentionally distracting or offending fellow competitor.
- iv. Any other ‘breaches of etiquette’ not listed above but are deemed to be serious by the Committee.

**PENALTY FOR BREACH OF CONDITION:
DISQUALIFICATION**

17. PRACTICE PRIVILEGES

Players are entitled to one free practice round the day before the championship. (8th June 2014)

18. INCLEMENT WEATHER AND SUSPENSION OF PLAY DUE TO DANGEROUS SITUATION

In the event that inclement weather should preclude the completion of the championship, the Committee will meet immediately and notify the participants of its decision

19. SUSPENSION OF PLAY DUE TO A DANGEROUS SITUATION (NOTE TO RULE 6-8b)

The specimen Condition in the Rules of Golf is in effect – see Appendix I Part C-4 on pages 140-141.

Note: Suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signaled by a prolonged note of a horn. All other suspensions will be signaled by three consecutive short notes of a horn, repeated. In either case, resumption of play will be signaled by two short notes of a horn, repeated.

20. RETURNING OF SCORE CARD

A player's score card is deemed officially returned to the Committee when he has deposited his or her score card in the card collection box at the card submission area.

21. INDEMNITY / LIABILITIES

In signing the Entry Form, participants in this Championship shall indemnify and not hold liable, Sarawak Golf Association, the Sponsors, the Organizers or the Host Club for any loss or damages to their equipment or personal belongings or harm or any form of injuries that the participants of the Championship may suffer as a result of the participation in this Championship.

22. DISPUTES AND DOUBTFUL POINTS

Any dispute or doubtful point on the Rules shall be referred to any of the appointed referees as soon as possible on completion of the round before the player submits his score card and in any case not later than 15 minutes after completing the round.

23. RESULT OF CHAMPIONSHIP-COMPETITION CLOSED

When the Championship Trophy is presented to the winner, the results of the competition are deemed officially announced and the competition is closed.
