28TH MERDEKA CUP 2014 LOCAL RULES

1. Out of Bounds – Rule 27-1

Defined by white stakes, railings or white lines on the ground.

A ball which crosses the white stakes to the right of Hole 1 and 9 and comes to rest beyond the stakes is Out of Bounds, even though it may lie on another part of the course. To the left of the 11th fairway, where the Out-Of-bounds line meets the water hazard margin, the Out-Of-Bounds line shall be extrapolated as indicated by the stakes to infinity.

2. Water Hazards (Including Lateral Water Hazards) – Rule 26

- a.) Water hazards are defined by yellow stakes or lines.
- b.) Lateral water hazards are defined by red stakes or lines.

Note: Dropping Zones for Water Hazards

Dropping zones are provided for the respective water hazards at Holes 6, 10 and 18. Each dropping zone is applicable only to the specific hole being played and not when the player is playing any other hole.

If the ball is in or it is virtually certain that a ball which has not been found is in the respective water hazard at the above mentioned holes, the player may:

- 1. Proceed under Rule 26-1; or
- 2. As an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.

3. Immovable Obstructions - Rule 24-2

All stakes defining water hazards and lateral water hazards.

4. Ground Under Repair - Rule 25-1

- a) Areas defined by white lines;
- b) Tyre rut;
- c) Rain erosion areas in bunkers;

5. Protection of Young Trees

Protection of young trees identified by blue stakes. Relief **must** be taken in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b (Appendix. I, Part B-3).

6. Embedded Ball

Relief extended to "through the green" (App. I, Part B-4).

7. Stones in Bunkers

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies)

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES:

Match Play – Loss of hole; Stroke Play – Two Strokes

Siren signal

Discontinue Play Immediately: One prolonged note of siren. Discontinue Play.....: Three consecutive notes of siren, repeated. Resume Play.....: Two short notes of siren, repeated.
