BRIEF BACKGROUND OF BORNEO LADIES GOLF CHALLENGE TROPHY

How it all Started


Borneo Ladies Golf Challenge Trophy Tournament (BLGCT) first started in 1991. The main Objective of the tournament was to promote the game of golf and to foster friendship amongst lady golfers from the various races and nationalities residing on the island of Borneo. The participating teams are from Sabah, Brunei Darussalam, Labuan FT and Sarawak. Whilst lady golfers from Kalimantan participated for the first and only time in 2010.

Sabah hosted and won the inaugural tournament. Since then each participating team took turn to host the tournament bi-annually. With its growing popularity amongst the ladies golfing fraternity, it was agreed in 2005 by all the Lady Captains of participating clubs that the Borneo Ladies Golf Challenge Trophy became an annual event. Since its inception 32 years ago, BLGCT has been successful in its objectives and has been popular with the lady golfers in Borneo.

Kelab Golf Miri is extremely privileged and honoured to host this 21st Borneo Ladies Golf Challenge Trophy this year after a lapse of 3 years i.e 2020 to 2022 due to lockdown as a result of covid-19 pandemic. A record of 150 participants from 18 clubs are participating in this 2-day event.

THE 21ST BORNEO LADIES GOLF CHALLENGE TROPHY 2023 16TH-17TH MARCH 2023

TERMS OF COMPETITION

The following Local Rules and Terms of Competition, together with any additions or amendments published by The Committee on the relevant entry form or at the golf course, will apply to this Championship:-

1. MANAGEMENT

The 21st Borneo Ladies Golf Challenge Trophy 2023 (BLGCT 2023) is under the management of the Tournament Committee jointly formed by the Organising Chair of BLGCT 2023, the Tournament Director and other golf referees. This Committee reserves the right to amend the Championship Conditions and the decision of the Committee will, in all matters, be final.

2. VENUE & DATES

The 21st Borneo Ladies Golf Challenge Trophy 2023 shall be held at Kelab Golf Miri from 16th to 17th March 2023.

3. RULES OF PLAY

The Rules of Golf effective January 2019 as approved by R&A Rules Ltd and their interpretations as contained in the "Official Guide to the Rules of Golf effective January 2019", these Terms of Competitions and any additional Terms of Competitions together with the Local Rules established by the Committee for BLGCT 2023 will apply.

4. FORMAT

(a) Team Event

The Team Event will take precedence over Individual Events.

There will be a singular team from each of the following 4 territories: Sarawak, Sabah, Brunei Darussalam and Labuan.

The Team Event will be decided by stroke play over 2 rounds of 18 holes. The Team with the lowest aggregate Nett scores will be the winner.

Each Team shall consist of four (4) players who shall be the players registered under that territory who returned the 4 best aggregate 36 hole nett scores at the completion of the 2 rounds. In the event that any or all of the 2 rounds cannot be completed due to unforeseen circumstances like inclement weather etc, the tournament committee would meet and decide on the procedure to determine the team composition and its decision on this matter shall be final.

(b) Individual Events

A player will elect on the Entry Form, the Category she wishes to participate in, failing which, she will play in the Open Event. All players aged 18 years or younger must play in the Junior Event.

The individual events will be decided by stroke play over 2 rounds of 18 holes. The individual events are Nett taking precedence over Gross.

- i. Open Event (aged 19 years and above)
- ii. Senior Event (aged 55 to 69 years)
- iii. Super Senior Event (aged 70 years and above)
- iv. Junior Event (aged 15-18 years)

The Tournament Committee may cancel any round or rounds if it determines that the course is not in a playable condition or that there are circumstances that render the proper playing of the game impossible.



5. ELIGIBILITY AND HANDICAP

Entries are open to all lady amateur golfers, including junior players aged 15-18 years, who are citizens or residents of the respective regions with a current NHS/USGA Handicap Index of 32.7 & below or a maximum Course Handicap of 36. In the event that a player has more than one handicap then her lowest handicap shall be used for the Championship. It is the sole responsibility of the players to declare their lowest handicap. Failure to comply shall result in DISQUALIFICATION in the Handicap event.

Handicap will be adjusted after Round 1 in accordance with the Modification Table in paragraph 19. Miscellaneous (c) below.

6. THE FIELD

Entries are limited to 144 players from Golf Clubs in Sarawak, Sabah, Brunei Darussalam and Labuan. Quotas allocated for each territory are as follows:-

Sarawak : 48 players Sabah : 48 players Brunei Darussalam : 24 players Labuan : 24 players

Should a territory/region not be able to fill its quota, another may take up their slots on a first come first served basis. The Championship will proceed with a minimum of 40 players.

7. ENTRY FORM, ENTRY FEE AND CLOSING DATE

The entry fee for the Tournament shall be RM380 inclusive of buggy fees.

Duly completed entry form together with the entry fee must reach the Tournament Committee, Kelab Golf Miri, Sarawak on or before 12:00 noon 15th December 2022 (Fax No: 6085-417848). Entries by telephone or without payment will not be accepted.

The entry fee is not refundable if cancellation is made after the closing date but the player is entitled to her goodie bag.

All entries will be subjected to the approval of the Tournament Committee, which reserves the right to accept or refuse, or having accepted, subsequently reject any entry without giving any reason for its decision.

8. TIMES OF STARTING AND GROUPS

The times of starting and groups for the Championship shall be established by the Tournament Committee and posted on KGM Notice Board on 15th March 2023. Such posting is deemed to be sufficient notice to the players.

The Tournament Committee reserves the right to vary the draw and starting times at its absolute discretion.

9. PRIZES

(a) Team Event (Open to all participants except Juniors)

Winner - 4 prizes + 4 trophies

1st Runner-up - 4 prizes + 4 trophies

2nd Runner-up - 4 prizes + 4 trophies

3rd Runner-up - 4 prizes



(b) Individual Events

i. Open Event (Aged 19 years and above)

Nett 36 holes - 6 prizes + 3 trophies Gross 36 holes - 6 prizes + 3 trophies

ii. Senior Event (Aged 55-69 years)

Nett 36 holes - 3 prizes Gross 36 holes - 3 prizes

iii. Super Senior Event (Aged 70 years and above)

Nett 36 holes - 1 prize

iv. Junior Event (Aged 15-18 years)

Nett 36 holes - 3 prizes (for minimum of 10 players)

v. Daily Prizes (Open to all participants except Juniors)

Nett - 2 prizes per round Gross - 2 prizes per round

(c) Limitation of Prizes

- * Each competitor is eligible to win one prize only with the exception of novelty prizes. If she is in contention for a prize in both Gross and Nett events, she will be awarded the better of the two prizes in terms of value.
- * The Tournament Committee reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of prizes in any category.

10. DECIDING TIES Team Event

Team Event

In the event of a tie for all places, the tie shall be decided by a count back system of matching score cards of the players with the lowest aggregate Nett scores in the following order:

- i. Last 18 holes;
- ii. Last 9 holes;
- iii. Last 6 holes;
- iv. Last 3 holes;
- v. Last hole.

If, after matching score cards as above, the tie is still undecided, it shall be decided by lot.

Individual Events

In the event of a tie for all places, the tie shall be decided by a count back system of matching score cards in the following order:

- i. Last 18 holes;
- ii. Last 9 holes;
- iii. Last 6 holes:
- iv. Last 3 holes;
- v. Last hole.

If, after matching score cards as above, the tie is still undecided, it shall be decided by lot.

11. TEEING AREAS

All players shall tee off the red teeing areas.

12. TRANSPORTATION

All players will use buggies on a twin sharing basis unless she is the odd one out in the group.



13. PACE OF PLAY (Note to Rule 5.6b)

(a) Time Allowed:

Each hole has been given a maximum completion time based upon the length and difficulty of the hole. The maximum time allotted for the completion of 18 holes will be available prior to play.

Definition of Out of Position:

The first group and any group after a starter's gap will be considered to be "out of position" if, at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes completed. Any following group will be considered "out of position" if it is more than the starting interval behind the group in front and has exceeded the time allowed for the number of holes played.

(b) Procedure When Group is Out of Position:

1. If a decision is taken to time the group, each player in the group will be subject to individual timing by a Rules Official. Each player in the group will be advised that they are "out of position" and are being timed.

- 2. The maximum time allocated per shot is 40 seconds. 10 extra seconds are allowed for the first player to play:
- from the teeing area on a par three hole;
- · an approach shot; and
- a chip or putt

The timing will start when a player has had sufficient time to reach her ball, it is her turn to play and she is able to play without interference or distraction.

On the putting green, timing will start when the player has had a reasonable amount of time to lift, clean and replace her ball, repair ball marks and move loose impediments on her line of putt. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole and/or behind the ball will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

If any player exceeds the time allocated, she shall be deemed to have had a "Bad Time".

3. Timing ceases when a group is back in position and players will be advised accordingly.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF Local Rule:

Penalty for first breach -- one stroke penalty

Penalty for the second -- General Penalty applied in addition to the penalty for the first breach Penalty for the third breach - - Disqualification

(c) Procedure When Again Out of Position during Same Round:


If a group is "out of position" more than once during a round, the above procedure will apply on each occasion. Bad times and the application of penalties in the same round will be carried forward until the round is completed. A player will not be penalised if she has a second bad time before being advised of her earlier bad time.

14. SUSPENSION OF PLAY DUE TO A DANGEROUS SITUATION

A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signalled by a prolonged note of a siren/horn. All other suspensions will be signalled by three consecutive short notes of a siren/horn, repeated. In either case, resumption of play will be signalled by two short notes of a siren/horn, repeated. See Rule 5.7b.

15. RETURNING OF SCORECARDS - Rule 3.3b

A player's score card is deemed officially returned to the Committee when she has deposited her score card in the card collection box at the card submission area.





16. DISPUTES AND DOUBTFUL POINTS

Any dispute or doubtful point on the Rules shall be referred to any of the appointed referees as soon as possible on completion of the round before the player submits her score card and in any case not later than 15 minutes after completing the round.

17. RESULT OF CHAMPIONSHIP-COMPETITION CLOSED - Rule 20

When the Championship Trophy is presented to the winner, the results of the competition are deemed officially announced and the competition is closed.

18. INDEMNITY AND LIABILITIES

All golfers must have valid golf insurance. In signing the Entry Form, participants in this Championship shall indemnify and not hold liable, Sarawak Golf Association, the Sponsors, the Organisers or the Host Club for any loss or damages to their equipment or personal belongings or harm or any form of injuries that the participants of the Championship may suffer as a result of the participation in this Championship.

KGM LOCAL RULES

LOCAL RULES Effective 1st August 2022 - final edition

The game of golf shall be played in accordance to the Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and the following Local Rules of Kelab Golf Miri apply.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF A LOCAL RULE General Penalty - Match Play - Loss of Hole; Stroke Play - Two Strokes

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 18.2)

A ball is out of bounds when it is beyond the course-side edge of white stakes at ground level which define the boundary edge of the course.

- On the right of Hole 1, 3, 4, 5, 9 & to the left of Hole 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 17, 18 and and behind the putting green of Hole 9 and 18;

Note: When the boundary is defined by a white stakes on the ground, and the white stakes are boundary objects from which free relief is NOT available.

2. PENALTY AREAS (Rule 17)

All penalty areas are defined by Red stakes or Yellow stakes;

Note: At Hole 5, 100 yards to the green and behind the putting green defined using Red stakes

3. DROPPING ZONES (D.Z.) FOR PENALTY AREA

If a ball is in the penalty area at Hole 4, 5, 6, 10, 12, 13, and 18 including when it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found came to rest in the penalty area, the player has these options, each with one penalty stroke:

- (a) Take relief under Rule 17.1, or
- (b) As an extra option, drop the original ball or another ball in the Dropping Zone defined by Yellow lines or Dropping Zone Signages. The dropping zone is a relief area under Rule 14.3. A ball must be dropped and come to rest in the relief area.

4. ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (Including Immovable Obstructions) (Rule 16.1)

(a) Ground Under Repair

- (i) All areas bounded by a GUR Signages, white line or barrier tape
- (ii) Areas in bunkers where sand has been removed by the movement of water resulting in deep furrows through the sand.
- (iii) Newly turfed areas in the general areas (including for those in the rough) demarcated by GUR signages, barrier tape and or white line.
- (iv) Small open drains through the green.

Relief from Seams of Cut Turf - If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam of cut turf or a seam interferes with the player's area of intended swing:

- (i) Ball in General Area The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.
- (ii) Ball on Putting Green. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1d. But interference does not exist if the seam only interferes with the player's stance.

(b) Immovable Obstructions

- (i) Buggy paths, yardages stakes, sprinkler heads, control valves, sump covers, shelters, halfway houses, concrete bins & teeing-area signages.
- (ii) Young trees, & flowerbeds, marked by blue stakes supported by wooden / concrete bins and/or wires except when located within the penalty areas.
- (iii) Protective fence between or at Hole 4, 5, 6, 15, & Hole 16 including its surrounding plants defined by blue stakes.

(iv) Notes:

- (a) If a ball strikes the stakes supporting young trees, yardages stakes, concrete bins, protective fence the stroke counts, and the ball must be played as it lies.
- (b) **NO free relief** is allowed from the **mental distraction or line of play/sight intervention** from the items listed in 4(c) (I)-(IV) above.

5. MOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 15.2)

- (a) Red, and Yellow stakes
- (b) Barrier stakes, barrier tape & barrier rope

6. INTEGRAL OBJECTS (Free Relief NOT Available)

(a) Young trees with supports & newly turfed areas / ground indentations when located within the penalty areas.

7. EDGING GROOVES NEAR PUTTING GREEN (Model Local Rules F-19)

The edging grooves around the aprons of putting green are ground under repair (GUR). If a player's ball lies in or touches a groove or a groove interferes with the area of intended swing:

- (a) Ball in General Area (fairway). Player may take free relief under Rule 16.1b by **dropping** the original ball or another ball at the nearest point of complete relief not nearer the hole in the general area.
- (b) Ball on Putting Green (part of the ball touches the putting green surface). Player may take free relief under Rule 16.1d by placing the original ball or another ball on the spot of the nearest point of complete relief not nearer the hole either on the putting green or in the general area.

BUT interference does not exist if the edging groove only interferes with the player's stance.

8. SUSPENSION OF PLAY (Rule 5.7)

The following signals will be used to suspend and resume play:

- Stop Play Immediately & Clear the Course One (1) prolonged note of siren for 45 seconds.
- Normal Stop Three (3) consecutive notes of siren for 10 seconds each.
- Resume Play Two (2) short notes of siren for 10 seconds each.
- Course Closed Permanently Two (2) long blast of sirens of 45 seconds each.
